Power safety



Please follow these safety instructions for best performance, and long life for your monitor.













- The AC plug isolates this equipment from the AC supply.
- The power supply cord serves as a power disconnect device for pluggable equipment. The socket outlet should be installed near the equipment and be easily accessible.
- This product should be operated from the type of power indicated on the marked label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your dealer or local power company.
- The Class I pluggable equipment Type A must be connected to protective earth.
- An approved power cord greater or equal to H03VV-F or H05VV-F, 2G or 3G, 0.75mm² must be used.
- Use only the power cord provided by BenQ. Never use a power cord that appears to be damaged or frayed.

For Germany only:

- (If the weight of the product is less than or equal to 3 kg) An approved power cord greater or equal to H03VV-F, 3G, 0.75mm² must be used.
- (If the weight of the product is more than 3 kg) An approved power cord greater or equal to H05VV-F or H05RR-F, 3G, 0.75mm² must be used.
- (If a remote control is provided) RISK OF EXPLOSION IF BATTERY IS REPLACED BY AN INCORRECT TYPE. DISPOSE OF USED BATTERIES ACCORDING TO THE INSTRUCTIONS.

For models with adapter:

- Use only the power adapter supplied with your LCD Monitor. Use of another type of power adapter will result in malfunction and/or danger.
- Allow adequate ventilation around the adapter when using it to operate the device or charge the battery. Do not cover the power adapter with paper or other objects that will reduce cooling. Do not use the power adapter while it is inside a carrying case.
- Connect the power adapter to a proper power source.
- Do not attempt to service the power adapter. There are no service parts inside. Replace the unit if it is damaged or exposed to excess moisture.

Care and cleaning

- Do not place the monitor face down on the floor or a desk surface directly. Otherwise, scratches on the panel surface may occur.
- The equipment is to be secured to the building structure before operation.
- (For models that support wall or ceiling mounting)
 - Install your monitor and monitor mounting kit on a wall with flat surface.
 - Ensure that the wall material and the standard wall mount bracket (purchased separately) are stable enough to support the weight of the monitor.
 - Turn off the monitor and the power before disconnecting the cables from the LCD monitor.
- Always unplug the product from the power outlet before cleaning. Clean the LCD monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Avoid using any liquid, aerosol or glass cleaners.
- Slots and openings on the back or top of the cabinet are for ventilation. They must not be blocked or covered. Your monitor should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat sources, or in a built-in installation unless proper ventilation is provided.
- Do not place heavy loads on the monitor to avoid possible personal injury or damage to the monitor.
- Consider keeping the box and packaging in storage for use in the future when you may need to transport the monitor.
- Refer to the product label for information on power rating, manufacture date, and identification markings.

Servicing

- Do not attempt to service this product yourself, as opening or removing covers may expose
 you to dangerous voltages or other risks. If any of the above mentioned misuse or other
 accident such as dropping or mishandling occurs, contact qualified service personnel for
 servicing.

Caution

- The monitor should be $50 \sim 70$ cm ($20 \sim 28$ inches) away from your eyes.
- Looking at the screen for an extended period of time causes eye fatigue and may deteriorate your eyesight. Rest your eyes for $5 \sim 10$ minutes for every 1 hour of product use.
- Reduce your eye strain by focusing on objects far way.
- Frequent blinking and eye exercise help keep your eyes from drying out.





How to assemble your monitor hardware



- If the computer is turned on you must turn it off before continuing.

 Do not plug-in or turn-on the power to the monitor until instructed to do so.
- The following illustrations are for your reference only. Available input and output jacks may vary depending on the purchased model.
- Avoid finger pressure on the screen surface.

I. Attach the monitor base.




Please be careful to prevent damage to the monitor. Placing the screen surface on an object like a stapler or a mouse will crack the glass or damage the LCD substrate voiding your warranty. Sliding or scraping the monitor around on your desk will scratch or damage the monitor surround and controls.

Protect the monitor and screen by clearing a flat open area on your desk and placing a soft item like the monitor packaging bag on the desk for padding.


Gently lay the screen face down on a flat clean padded surface.




Attach the monitor stand to the monitor base as illustrated until it locks in place.



Raise the thumbscrew lid and tighten the thumbscrew as illustrated. Then push the lid back.




Orient and align the stand arm with the monitor, then push them together until they click and lock into place.




Tighten the screw(s) that fixes the stand to the monitor.

- To secure or release a screw, a flat-head screwdriver or a coin is required.
- Depending on the monitor size, there may be more than one screw that fixes the stand to the monitor. The illustrations in this document are for your reference only and may look different from the appearance of the product.

Carefully lift the monitor, turn it over and place it upright on its stand on a flat even surface.






- You should position the monitor and angle the screen to minimize unwanted reflections from other light sources.
- Your monitor is an edge-to-edge and ultra slim monitor and should be handled with care. Avoid finger pressure on the screen surface. Adjust the screen angle by placing your hands on the top and on the bottom of the monitor as illustrated. Excessive force on the display is prohibited.




2. Connect the PC video cable.

Connect the plug of the HDMI cable to the HDMI port on the monitor. Connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI port of a digital output device.




3. Connect the audio cable.

You may connect headphones to the headphone jack found on the back side of the monitor.



4. Connect the power cable to the monitor.

Connect the power cord to the power adapter. Plug one end of the power cord into the socket labelled ____ on the rear of the monitor. Do not connect the other end to a power outlet just yet.



5. Connect-to and turn-on the power.

Plug the other end of the power cord into a power outlet and turn it on.






Turn on the monitor by pressing the power button on the monitor.

To extend the service life of the product, we recommend that you use your computer's power management function.






How to detach the stand and the base

1. Prepare the monitor and area.


Turn off the monitor and the power before unplugging the power cable. Turn off the computer before unplugging the monitor signal cable.


Protect the monitor and screen by clearing a flat open area on your desk and placing a soft item like a towel on the desk for padding, before laying the screen face down on a flat clean padded surface.



2. Remove the monitor stand.


Release the screw(s) that fixes the stand to the monitor. Then pull the monitor stand backward away from the monitor.






3. Remove the monitor base.

Release the screw on the bottom of the monitor base and detach the monitor base as illustrated.









Using the monitor wall mounting kit

The back of your LCD monitor has a VESA standard mount with 100mm pattern, allowing the installation of a wall mount bracket. Before starting to install a monitor wall mounting kit, please read the precautions carefully.

Precautions

- •Install your monitor and monitor mounting kit on a wall with flat surface.
- •Ensure that the wall material and the standard wall mount bracket (purchased separately) are stable enough to support the weight of the monitor. Refer to the product specifications on the website for weight information.
- •Turn off the monitor and the power before disconnecting the cables from the LCD monitor.
- I. Remove the monitor stand.

Lay the screen face down on a clean and well-padded surface. Detach the monitor stand as instructed in step $1\sim2$ in How to detach the stand and the base on page 17.



- 2. Follow the instruction manuals of the wall mount bracket you purchased to complete the installation.
- Use four M4 x 10 mm screws to fix a VESA standard wall mount bracket to the monitor. Make sure that all screws are tightened and secured properly. Consult a professional technician or BenQ service for wall mount installation and safety precautions.



Getting the most from your BenQ monitor

To gain the most benefit from your new BenQ LCD monitor, you should install the custom BenQ LCD Monitor driver software as provided on the local website. See Downloading the LCD Monitor driver files from the Internet on page 19 for details.

The circumstances under which you connect and install your BenQ LCD Monitor will determine which process you need to follow to successfully install the BenQ LCD Monitor driver software. These circumstances relate to which version of Microsoft Windows you are using, and whether you are connecting the monitor and installing the software onto a new computer (without existing monitor driver software), or whether you are upgrading an existing installation (which already has existing monitor driver software) with a newer monitor.

In either case however, the very next time you turn on your computer (after connecting the monitor to your computer), Windows will automatically recognize the new (or different) hardware, and will launch its **Found New Hardware wizard**.

Follow the wizard instructions. Further details and step-by-step instructions for either an automatic (new) or upgrade (existing) installation, see:

- If you require a User Name and Password to login to your Windows computer, you must be logged on as an Administrator or as a member of the Administrators group in order to install the monitor driver software. Furthermore, if your computer is connected to a network which has security access requirements, network policy settings may prevent you from installing software on your computer.
- To check the name of the purchased model, refer to the specification label on the back of the monitor.

Downloading the LCD Monitor driver files from the Internet

- 1. Download the correct driver files from Support.BenQ.com.
- 2. On your computer, have your driver files extracted into an empty folder. Remember the file location the files are extracted to.

How to install the monitor on a new computer

This instruction details the procedure for selecting and installing the BenQ LCD Monitor driver software on a new computer which has never had a monitor driver installed before. This instruction is only suitable for a computer which has never been used before, and for which the BenQ LCD Monitor is the first ever monitor to be connected to it.



If you are adding the BenQ LCD Monitor to an existing computer that has already had another monitor connected to it (and has monitor driver software installed), you should not be following these instructions. You should instead be following the instructions for How to upgrade the monitor on an existing computer.

- Follow the instructions in How to assemble your monitor hardware on page 13.
 When Windows starts, it will automatically detect the new monitor and launch the Found New Hardware Wizard. Follow the prompts until it displays the option to Install Hardware Device Drivers.
- 2. Check Search for a suitable driver for my device option, and click Next.
- 3. Look to confirm that the wizard has selected the correct name of your monitor and click **Next**.
- 4. Click Finish.
- 5. Restart the computer.

How to upgrade the monitor on an existing computer

This instruction details the procedure for manually updating the existing monitor driver software on your Microsoft Windows computer. It is currently tested as compatible for Windows 10, Windows 8 (8.1), and Windows 7 Operating System (OS).



The BenQ LCD Monitor driver for your model may well function perfectly with other versions of Windows, however, as at the time of writing, BenQ has done no testing of this driver on other versions of Windows and cannot guarantee its operation on those systems.

Installing monitor driver software involves selecting an appropriate information file (.inf) from the downloaded driver files for the particular model monitor you have connected, and letting Windows install the corresponding driver files. You need only steer it in the right direction. Windows has an Upgrade Device Driver Wizard to automate the task and guide you through the file selection and installation process.

How to install on Windows 10 system

I. Open Display Properties.

Go to **Start**, **Settings**, **Devices**, **Devices and Printers** and right-click the name of your monitor from the menu.

- 2. Select **Properties** from the menu.
- 3. Click the **Hardware** tab.
- 4. Click **Generic PnP Monitor**, and then the **Properties** button.
- 5. Click the **Driver** tab and the **Update Driver** button.
- 6. In the **Update Driver Software** window, select the option **Browse my computer for** driver software.
- 7. Click **Browse** and locate the driver files downloaded from the Internet as instructed in Downloading the LCD Monitor driver files from the Internet on page 19.
- 8. Click Close.

You may be prompted to restart your computer after the driver update is complete.

How to install on Windows 8 (8.1) system

I. Open Display Properties.

Move the cursor to the lower-right of the screen or press the **Windows** + **C** buttons on the keyboard to bring up the **Charm** bar. Go to **Settings**, **Control Panel**, **Devices and Printers** and right-click the name of your monitor from the menu.

Alternatively, right-click the desktop and select **Personalize**, **Display**, **Devices and Printers**, and right-click the name of your monitor from the menu.

- 2. Select **Properties** from the menu.
- 3. Click the **Hardware** tab.
- 4. Click Generic PnP Monitor, and then the Properties button.
- 5. Click the **Driver** tab and the **Update Driver** button.
- 6. In the **Update Driver Software** window, select the option **Browse my computer for** driver software.
- 7. Click **Browse** and locate the driver files downloaded from the Internet as instructed in Downloading the LCD Monitor driver files from the Internet on page 19.
- 8. Click Close.

You may be prompted to restart your computer after the driver update is complete.

How to install on Windows 7 system





Basic menu operation

All OSD (On Screen Display) menus can be accessed by the control keys. You can use the OSD menu to adjust all the settings on your monitor.



- I. Press any of the control keys.
- 2. The hot key menu is displayed. Some of the controls are custom keys and are designated for particular functions.
- 3. Select (Menu) to access the main menu.

4. In the main menu, follow the icons next to the control keys to make adjustments or selection. See Navigating the main menu on page 32 for details on the menu options.

The hot keys only operate while the main menu is not currently displaying. Hot key displays will disappear after a few seconds of no key activity.

• To unlock the OSD controls, press and hold any key for 5 seconds.

Customizing the hot keys


The second and the third control keys counted from the left (also called custom keys) perform as hot keys to provide direct access to pre-defined functions. You can change the default setting and designate different functions for these keys.

- 1. Press any of the control keys to bring up the hot key menu, and press (Menu) to access the main menu.
- 2. Go to **Custom Key**.
- 3. Select the custom key you want to change. It is either **Custom Key I** or **Custom Key 2**.
- 4. On the sub menu, select a category.
- 5. Under the category, check to select up to 3 items for the quick access by this key.

Working with the HDRi hot key

The monitor takes advantage of Bright Intelligence Plus technology to balance screen brightness while playing HDR content to keep all image details. You are provided with a hot key to switch to a preferred HDR setting easily.

- Make sure HDR content is available. See Working with HDR technology on page 28 for more information. HDR function is enabled automatically once HDR content is available to the monitor.
- 2. Press the HDRi hot key to bring up a list of HDR settings.
- 3. Press repeatedly to cycle through the options to the desired one. See HDR Mode on page 37 for more information.





To enable B.I.+ or HDR respectively, see Adjusting screen brightness automatically (Bright Intelligence Plus) on page 28 or Enabling HDR function on page 29.

Adjusting screen brightness automatically (Bright Intelligence Plus)



The Bright Intelligence Plus function works with certain color modes only. If it is not available, its menu options will become grayed out.

The built-in light sensor works with Bright Intelligence Plus technology to detect the ambient light, image brightness, contrast, and color temperature, and then balance the screen automatically. It helps keep image details as well as to reduce eye strain.

To enable this function, go to **Eye Care** > **B.I.+** (Bright Intelligence Plus) > **ON**. It takes a few seconds to complete the adjustment.

If you select **Cinema HDRi** by pressing the HDRi hot key, the Bright Intelligence Plus function is enabled automatically.



The performance of Bright Intelligence Plus may be impacted by the light sources and the monitor tilt angle. You can increase the light sensor sensitivity from **Eye Care** > **B.I.+** (Bright Intelligence Plus) > **Sensor Sensitivity** if needed. See page 40 for more information.

Working with HDR technology



- Your monitor supports HDR10 technology.
- The information regarding HDR-compatible devices and content in this document is most up-to-date at the time of publication. For the latest information, contact your device manufacturer and content provider.

To enable HDR function, you need to have a compatible player and content.

1. Make sure a FHD/4K HDR player is ready. Players with the following names and resolutions are supported. Note that the 4K content on a FHD monitor get resized and is displayed at 1920×1080 .

Commonly used names for FHD/4K (may vary by manufacturer)	FHD, 4K, 4K Ultra HD, UHD, UHD 4K, Ultra HD, 2160p
Supported resolution or modes	1920 x 1080 @ 60 Hz
Commonly used names for HDR10 (may vary by manufacturer)	HDR Premium, High Dynamic Range, HDR, Ultra HD Premium

- 2. Make sure HDR content is available. Content may come from a FHD/4K player.
- 3. Make sure the player and the monitor have been connected via an appropriate cable:
 - the provided HDMI / DP / DP to mini DP cable / USB-C™ cable (if available)
 - an HDMI cable that is HDMI High Speed or HDMI Premium certified (for models with HDMI inputs)
 - a DP / DP to mini DP cable that is DisplayPort compliance certified (for models with DP inputs)
 - a certified USB-C[™] cable with DisplayPort Alternate Mode capability (for models with USB-C[™] inputs)

Enabling HDR function

If the instructions in Working with HDR technology on page 28 are followed and the input content is HDR-compatible, the OSD message **HDR**: **On** is displayed on the screen. This means your content player and content are HDR-compatible and the HDR function is properly enabled. The monitor is following the ST2084 standard to process the HDR content.

Press the HDRi hot key to bring up the HDR settings and select from the list. Alternatively, go to **Color** > **HDR Mode** for selection.

Enabling HDR-emulated mode

If the connection is complete and no OSD message is displayed, this means the content player and/or the content are not HDR-compatible. The monitor stays to the color mode recently chosen for non-HDR content. You can manually enable HDR-emulated mode by selecting **Cinema HDRi** or **HDR** from **HDR Mode**.

Adjusting volume quickly

To adjust the volume quickly, press the volume hot key. And then press the corresponding control keys as indicated by OSD icons for adjustment.



Choosing an audio scenario

Several audio equalizers are provided for audio playback in different scenarios.

Adjusting display mode

To display images of aspect ratio other than 16:9 and size other than the panel size of your purchased model, you can adjust the display mode on the monitor.

- 1. Press any of the control keys to bring up the hot key menu, and press (Menu) to access the main menu.
- 2. Go to Picture > Advanced > Display Mode.
- 3. Select an appropriate display mode. The setting will take effect immediately.

Choosing an appropriate picture mode

Your monitor provides various picture modes that are suitable for different types of images. See Color Mode on page 36 for all the available picture modes.

Go to **Color > Color Mode** for a desired picture mode.

Connecting the monitor to your MacBook series product

While the monitor is connected to your MacBook series product, switch to **M-book** mode which represents MacBook's color matching and visual representation on your monitor.

- 1. Connect your monitor to the MacBook series product.
- 2. Go to Color > Color Mode.
- 3. Select **M-book**. The setting will take effect immediately.

Enabling color vision accessibility (Color Weakness)

Color Weakness is accessibility that helps people with color vision deficiency to distinguish colors. You are provided with **Red Filter** and **Green Filter** on this monitor. Choose one as needed.

- 1. Go to Eye Care > Color Weakness.
- 2. Choose either **Red Filter** or **Green Filter**.
- 3. Adjust the value of the filter. A stronger effect is produced as the value increases.

Activating FreeSync

Monitors featuring with the VESA standard FreeSync will eliminate screen tearing, stuttering, and juddering during gaming.

Working with Video Format Support technology

Your monitor supports playback of 24P videos if they were originally produced at this frame rate. With Video Format Support technology the monitor displays such videos at the correct cadence without any pulldowns to distort the source video. This function is enabled automatically if compatible content is available to the monitor.

Navigating the main menu

? The image is blurred.

Download **Resolution file** from the website (see Product support on page 3). Refer to "Adjusting the Screen Resolution". And then select the correct resolution, refresh rate and make adjustments based on these instructions.

Does the blurring only occur at resolutions lower than the native (maximum) resolution?

Download **Resolution file** from the website (see Product support on page 3). Refer to "Adjusting the Screen Resolution". Select the native resolution.

Pixel errors can be seen.

One of several pixels is permanently black, one or more pixels are permanently white, one or more pixels are permanently red, green, blue or another color.

Clean the LCD screen.Cycle power on-off.

• These are pixels that are permanently on or off and is a natural defect that occurs in LCD technology.

The image has a faulty coloration.

lt has a yellow, blue or pink appearance.

Go to **Color > Advanced > Reset Color**, and then choose **YES** to reset the color settings to the factory defaults.

If the image is still not correct and the OSD also has faulty coloration, this means one of the three primary colors is missing in the signal input. Now check the signal cable connectors. If any pin is bent or broken off, please contact your dealer to get necessary support.

- The image is displaced in one direction.

Faint shadow from the static image displayed is visible on the screen.



- Activate the power management function to let your computer and monitor go into a low power "sleep" mode when not actively in use.



Sensors

- If there are any obstacles in front of the sensor that keep the sensor from detecting the light properly.
- If there are any objects or clothing in bright colors in front of the sensor. Bright colors (especially white and fluorescent colors) reflect light and the sensor cannot detect the main light sources.



HDR
